


IMPORTANT ROLE OF CHURCHES



- **All disasters begin locally**—and churches are already embedded in the neighborhoods that are first impacted.
- **Faith communities offer trusted relationships**, physical space, and willing volunteers that can be mobilized quickly in times of crisis.
- **Churches are vital partners** in working alongside emergency managers, nonprofits, and government agencies to meet diverse community needs.
- **Preparedness begins with defined roles**—churches can plan how they'll serve, such as calling volunteers, hosting nonprofit partners, offering feeding sites, or providing emotional and spiritual care.



SHARING YOUR MISSION, AMPLIFIES YOUR IMPACT

- **Churches with defined roles** serve more effectively during and after disasters.
- **Sharing those roles** with your local VOAD supports emergency managers, prevents overlap, and strengthens coordination.
- **Creating a plan doesn't commit your church to respond**—it simply helps others know what you're willing and able to do.
- Emergency management and your local VOAD **will ask, not task.**



HOW TERREBONNE COORDINATES INFORMATION AND RESOURCES WITH NON-PROFITS




What BARR does:


- Staff EOC seat for Volunteer & Donations Management

THE ASK: HOW YOUR CHURCH CAN HELP?

- **Share information with your local VOAD** to coordinate information with emergency managers and clarify your church's role in disaster.
- **Activate your volunteers and facilities** for serving in the community or distributing essential supplies.
- **Offer spiritual and emotional care** to those in crisis.
- **Support long-term recovery** through volunteering, rebuilding, and network outreach.



Assess your existing service missions and engage your congregation to identify service areas


Form liaison roles with local VOAD groups to support local emergency management efforts

NEXT STEPS

- **Discuss your church's mission** in disaster response with your leadership team.
- **Identify your church's strengths**—volunteers, space, supplies, spiritual care, etc.
- **Fill out the worksheets** with your church or organization to share your plan and resources with your local VOAD and OEP
- **Designate a disaster liaison** to represent your church in planning and response efforts.
- **Complete a church readiness checklist** or create a basic ministry response plan.
- **Participate in trainings or VOAD meetings** to stay connected and informed.
