- 32nd JDC Family Preservation Court** – \$25,000 – Childcare, transportation, and other assistance for program participants
- A Place of Restoration** - \$25,000 - Food, school uniforms, toiletries, and cleaning supplies to homeless families
- Allen Chapel AME Church** - \$10,000 - Roof repair, mold mitigation, appliances
- Ascent Health** - \$26,000 – Gasoline distribution in South Lafourche
- Bayou Civic Club** - \$45,000 - Building repair and debris removal, purchase of generators, and operating support to resume community services in Lafourche

- Grand Isle Garden Club** - \$54,200 - Replace tractor and other lawn equipment and restoration of storage unit for equipment; bedding, bath, and kitchen supplies for 150 families moving into temporary trailers
- Grand Isle School** - \$50,000 – Replacement of classroom and teacher supplies
- Gulf Coast Baptist Church** - \$10,000 – Food and supply distribution in Golden Meadow
- Hache Grant Association** - \$40,000 – Distribution of food and supplies in Terrebonne Parish; mobile laundry and shower facility in Pointe-aux-Chenes
- HAP - Helping All People** - \$10,000 - Gifts and gift cards for 600 families/children living in Lower Terrebonne
